NOTE: The organizations on this list have been selected because they are nonpartisan entities committed to helping voters register and vote. While most of the organizations currently qualify as 501(c)(3) entities under tax laws, some may have 501(c)(4) status instead and any donations made will not be tax deductible. If a volunteer feels that the (c)(3) tax status is important, they should confirm with the organization about its tax status beforehand.
